THE WASH - A VITAL RESOURCE FOR WADERS

The Wash is an 150,000 acre embayment with intertidal mudflats, marine habitat and saltmarsh which hosts internationally important wader and wildfowl populations. It is an important stopover site on the East-Atlantic flyway for migrating waders, as well as a key wintering site.

THE IMPORTANCE OF THE GROUPS WORK FOR CONSERVATION

Since 1959, the group has pioneered novel fieldwork techniques used to safely capture, ring and release waders. These have become widely adopted in the International wader study community. This has led to the determination of the migratory routes of the majority of waders passing through the UK, and the particular importance of the Wash as a site for moulting waders in the Autumn. The impact of reduced shellfish availability on wader populations, the longevity of British wader species, the high annual survival rate of wintering Curlew (and poor juvenile recruitment), are just a few examples of how our data informs wader conservation.

THE CHARITY

The group became a charity in 2021 to help us support our work and achieve our aims by consolidating what we do and potentially expanding our research. We raise funds amongst members to carry out fieldwork activities and supply equipment to other research groups around the world. We are looking for other sources of funding, including regular contributions to the group.

AIMS OF THE GROUP

The group monitors waders using the Wash to provide a better understanding of their biology. This will allow decisions which may affect these waders to be taken in the light of factual information.

Work concentrates on 11 target species studying:

- the patterns of migration and origin of each species and any known populations;
- the importance of the Wash as a whole;
- the importance of sub areas of the Wash;
- the use of biometrics and other techniques to understand how birds use the Wash;
- Long-term population dynamics.
